QUALITY OF EDUCATION

Opportunity to Work in Canada

Full-time international students enrolled in a degree, diploma or certificate program at a designated institution can work up to 20 hours per week on or off-campus during the academic session and full-time during scheduled breaks. Successful graduates are eligible to apply for a post-graduation work permit to stay and work in Canada for up to three years. **Centennial College is an approved government institution for Canada’s Study and Work Programs!**



Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) offers flexibility in post-graduation work permit rules to help international students. **You can complete 100% of your studies online from outside Canada.** Studies completed from outside Canada until August 31, 2022, will count towards a future Post Graduation Work Permit (PGWP).




While deciding to pursue an education abroad, of course, the most important criteria for me were the quality of education, affordability, and the opportunity to find a job after graduation.



WORK ABROAD*

For two to four months, be placed in a global workplace directly related to your field of study as you earn placement or co-op credit for your program.

RESEARCH ABROAD*

Contribute to an applied research project, under experts' supervision, which allows you to explore new products and technologies. Taking place over the course of a semester, the research includes one to two weeks abroad.

STUDY ABROAD*

Spend two weeks to four months studying at one of our global partner institutions, learning a new language and experiencing a new culture or taking relevant courses to earn credit towards your program.

You can also participate in a faculty-led study for two weeks, gaining first-hand experience and practical knowledge relevant to your field of study while earning credit towards your program.







Alumnus Davis Fernandes launched a marketing career with help from networking opportunities



After completing an accounting and finance degree, it didn't take long for **Davis Fernandes** to realize his passion was elsewhere. What truly fascinated Davis was writing. The former, he says, created a solid foundation and offered an overview of the entire marketing sector. The latter helped him to specialize his strategy skills and knowledge. Freedom of Information Act
