



THE CANADIAN INSTITUTE OF FINANCIAL PLANNING (CIFP)

The Canadian Institute of Financial Planning (CIFP) is a non-profit association of certified financial planner professionals. The association is an independent, effective and powerful advocate for the Certified Financial Planner (CFP) certification marks and the financial planning profession in Canada.



CIFP is also a distance learning education institute wholly owned by The Canadian Institute of Financial Planning. This innovative institute was developed to combine the strengths of traditional classroom-based learning and distance education learning into one web-based campus. It provides programs for licensing and certification requirements in the financial services sector, including financial planning and continuing education courses. All CIFP programs are delivered through the web-based CIFP education portal.

The CIFP CFP certification program is comprised of four core courses and the Program Review and Evaluation course. This comprehensive program fully prepares you to write the first of two CFP® examinations, Financial Planning Examination Level 1 (FPE1®), which the Financial Planning Standards Council (FPSC) administers. The CIFP CFP certification program also provides a strong foundation of knowledge as you complete the CIFP FPSC-approved Capstone course and prepare for the second CFP examination, Financial Planning Examination Level 2 (FPE2®).

If you think helping people make informed investments to achieve their financial goals will be an interesting career, this program is for you. It will give you the knowledge and skills to work in settings such as financial institutions and trust companies. Included are the Financial Planning Certificate curriculum and two Canadian Securities Institute courses. Because today's financial service industry is rapidly changing, you will gain relevant credentials, and once you finish the program and associated industry exams, you may be eligible to write the Certified Financial Planner (CFP) exam leading to the CFP designation.

If you are a financial advisor who wants to sell mutual funds, you may want to consider completing course CCSC-103. If you have an interest in stocks, bonds and mutual funds, you should consider courses CCSC-101 and CCSC-102. Among employment opportunities are various positions such as personal banker, financial advisor, mortgage and loans officer, and self-employment as an independent financial planner.

In cooperation with the Canadian Securities Institute (CSI), Centennial College offers continuing education courses to help you prepare for the Institute's course exams. While there are no prerequisites, prior investment experience or postsecondary training in finance is recommended. For more information on the Canadian Securities Course®, please contact the CSI at 1-866-866-2601, or visit csi.ca. Once you register with Centennial College, you will be eligible for a 10 per cent discount on CSI courses. If you are registered in Canadian Securities Course (CSC) or Investment Funds in Canada (IFC), you are eligible to receive the CSC Check practice exams at no cost.

Note: You are required to first register with Centennial College to obtain your student number and then register online with CSI.

Standalone Courses

Accounting Micro. Application 1 | ACCT-228

IC

In this course, you will gain practical experience using email, word processing, presentation and accounting software from the Microsoft Office suite package, which today's businesses prevalently use. Sage 50cloud, which small- and medium-sized businesses use, will serve as the program's accounting software. You will learn to record business transactions in the general journal, accounts payables, accounts receivables and inventory modules, while also calculating and accounting for sales taxes.

Accounting Theory and Policy | ACCT-725 OL

This advanced course will teach you to critically evaluate standards such as reserve recognition, management discussion and analysis, employee stock options, post-employment benefits, financial instruments, ceiling tests, hedge accounting and comprehensive income. To ensure you have a strong grasp on the topics, the course will use practical and theoretical problems of the value model, foreign exchange accounting, the process and issues related to standard setting, agency theory and other matters relevant to current events. Integration of Canadian and U.S. standards with those of the International Accounting Standards Board (IASB) will also be presented.

Advanced Financial Accounting | ACCT-755 OL

An intermediate-level course, Advanced Financial Accounting will help you to develop and enhance your professional judgment and the ability to apply conceptual principles and accounting policies. It will cover topics such as recording and reporting of inter-corporate investments and business combinations, consolidation of subsidiaries, foreign currency transactions, foreign operations reporting and financial reporting in the not-for-profit sector. You will also learn about settings, both internationally and in Canada, relating to global financial reporting standards and accounting standards for private enterprises.

Financial Accounting 1 | ACCT-112 OL

This is an overview course that will focus on the financial reporting process. The recording process and the production of financial statements will be highlighted along with simple tools to analyze financial information and financial statements. This information will be relevant to managers, investors or other users of financial accounting information.

Financial Accounting 2 | ACCT-221 OL/PB

This is part two of the Financial Accounting course. Topics will include capital assets, current and long-term liabilities, corporations, statement of cash flow and financial statement analysis, and financial reporting concepts.

Introduction to Forensic Accounting | ACCT-361 OL

An online course, Introduction to Forensic Accounting will provide you with a basic understanding of this field. It is designed to make you more aware and knowledgeable in the detection and prevention of white-collar crimes. Although the course is mainly based on theory and case analysis, it will delve into financial statement analysis and other tools designed to detect fraud. It will also cover various preventative measures to consider, when designing systems, that will prevent the occurrence of fraud and other abuses.

Management Accounting 1 | ACCT-222

Introduced in this course will be managerial accounting concepts and terminology such as the elements of a job costing system, the application of cost-volume-profit analysis and the application of relevant costs to special decisions, including how they fit with the preparation of master budgets.

In Introduction to Personal Finance, you will acquire lifelong skills to make the most of your financial resources. By learning to apply concepts of economic risk and financial security, you will be able to prepare your personal financial plan, project your future needs and design an investment plan that will work toward your goals. You will also learn to promote your financial stability by researching current literature on personal finance issues.

Mortgage Agent | CEMA-101

If you are looking to become a licensed mortgage agent in Ontario with an understanding of the mortgage brokerage industry and an ability to perform the agent's role in the mortgage application process, this course is for you. In just 45 hours, it will cover all the Mortgage Agent Qualifying Standards (MAQS) identified by the regulatory body, the Financial Services Commission of Ontario (FSCO). Other topics will include the legislation that governs the industry, the role of the agent in consumer protection and ethical decision-making. To pass, you will be required to achieve 60 per cent overall, including a minimum of 60 per cent on the final exam.



Small Business - Financial | CEBS-107

The major purpose of this course is to prepare you to assume the role of an entrepreneur acting as a general manager, as opposed to an accounting technician or a financial specialist.

Managing the Small Business | CEBS-108

You will be introduced to best practices associated with managing a small company as well as universal and timeless theories and methods that cut across all major aspects of dealing with people, data and systems. Content and process skills, including decision-making, presenting arguments, building teams, introducing change and providing leadership will also be reviewed.

Retail Management | CEBS-120 OL

This course follows a practical managerial approach to retailing focused directly on issues owners, managers or employees of retail institutions face. It will assume prior knowledge of marketing, and cover the conceptual and analytical foundations necessary to understand all aspects of retail management.

How to Start a Small Business | CEBS-870

This course will guide you through the process of setting up a business. Content areas will include feasibility study, forms of ownership, financing, operations, marketing plans and personal skills. In short, this course will help transform your business idea into a functional business.

Change Management | ORIN-002

This course will cover the effects and management of change, which is a high priority for all organizations because managing change is important to facilitating successful project implementation. Course content will be based on the theory and application of change for the individual, change for the organization, communication and stakeholder en-gagement, and change management best practices.

Cybersecurity Policy and Governance | CYBR-401 OL

This non-technical cybersecurity course is aimed at professionals who work at all levels of an organization and want to gain knowledge and competencies in cybersecurity policy and governance. This course covers the basics of cybersecurity including cyberattacks, breaches, and cybercrimes. Students will explore topics such as the threat landscape, identifying who the bad actors are, and why different organization archetypes are prime targets. There will be an emphasis on the governance aspect of cybersecurity which includes preparedness and response lifecycle. A number of case studies will be presented to illuminate real-life examples of cybersecurity incidents with reinforcement of why cybersecurity education and awareness is so important. A reoccurring theme of this course is that cybersecurity awareness is everyone's responsibility especially along the entire value chain.

Cybersecurity Compliance and Financial Crime | CYBR-402 OL

The financial sector is a key target for cybercriminals due to the potential financial payoff that a cyber-breach can provide. This course is targeted toward financial professionals who work at all levels within a variety of industries. Basic concepts of cybersecurity will be covered to create a foundation for learning more focused topics of compliance and financial crime. Students will learn about the consequences of cybercrime events and the potential impact to the financial sector. Real-life examples from Canada, US and EU will be examined in areas of cyber investigation and how to respond to cybersecurity incident. Cybersecurity regulations and legislation will be covered as well as cybersecurity ethics for the financial sector. A reoccurring theme of this course is that cybersecurity awareness is everyone's responsibility along the value-chain. International case studies will be used to provide students an opportunity for meaningful discussion and working together to explore solutions to cybersecurity issues and concerns facing organizations of all sizes.

Ethics in Business | GNED-147

You will be introduced to the study of ethics and the case study method. Using a combination of research papers and case studies drawn from real business situations, you will discuss the cases, papers and solutions. Your grade will be determined by reports and presentations of various cases.

Creative and Critical Thinking | LSDV-100



Cannabis Law | CANA-300

This course is a broad introduction to the federal and provincial laws governing cannabis cultivation, production, distribution, and pos-session and use in Canada. The emphasis will primarily be on recreational and medical cannabis use in Ontario, with selected references to practices in other jurisdictions. You will become familiar with specific areas of law while learning to apply concepts and terminology to solve problems related to authorized recreational and medical cannabis use.

Court Transcription - Novice | CTRN-101 IC





Frequent traveller takes advantage of Part-time Learning online

It was Saturday in Rwanda, which meant that Centennial
College Part-time Learning student Janice Mills was heading
to a town where she could find a reliable Internet connection and submit her coursework.
While working with an organization involved in women's empowerment and literacy
required Mills to travel to Rwanda every six months, Centennial's flexible Part-time
Learning options allowed her to easily complete her program.

"I had never taken an online course before and I was pleasantly surprised," says Mills, who finished part one of Teaching English as a Second Language (TESL) in August 2019 and is currently taking the program's second portion. "At first, I thought it was just going to be reading, but there was a lot of interacting with students and the instructor. That meant I had accountability but could still set my own pace in that I was able to see the entire course overview, week by week, including what assignments would be due and how busy or light the coming weeks would be."

With online discussions, pair work (such as peer editing and receiving and giving feedback on assignments) and the ability to contact instructors both publicly and privately, Mills says Centennial fostered an online community that was, in many ways, akin to face-to-face classes.

"Because you could see your class list, I saw another woman taking all the same courses as me, so I reached out to her and we would email each other when we needed help, feedback or an opinion," says Mills. "You still get the social interaction, and I believe a lot of people don't think they'll get that."

While Mills opted for an online delivery, Centennial also facilitates many of the more than 1,300 Part-time Learning courses and program it offers at its campuses and satellite locations on weekends and in the evenings.

Mental Health First Aid Training | MHFA-101

While people often know a lot about physical health, mental health is a mystery to many. The Mental Health First Aid Training course will give you the tools and abilities to support someone experiencing a mental health crisis or developing mental health problems by teaching you about a range of mental health disorders and crisis situations. The Mental Health Commission of Canada designed this 12-hour training course.

Restorative Justice Practices | CSTR-901

Restorative justice is a unique approach to penalty that involves victims and offenders working together to reach an agreement on restitution. In this workshop, you will learn to create and run the restorative conferences at which this justice takes place. You will get experience with using the script that comes with the conference, learn about the different sociological and psychological foundations behind restorative conferences, and become familiar with the dos and don'ts of your role as a facilitator.

SafeTALK | CSTR-902

SafeTALK is a half-day workshop that will prepare anyone over the age of 15 to become a suicide-alert helper, no matter their previous experience or training. Most people with thoughts of suicide don't truly want to die but are struggling with the pain in their lives. As a SafeTALK-trained helper, you will be able to take action by connecting them with life-saving intervention resources such as caregivers qualified in Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST.)

Working in Toronto Shelters | CSCE-100

This course, by examining the complexities of homelessness and the challenges it creates for individuals or families, will benefit anyone interested in learning about or working with people experiencing homelessness in Toronto. You will gain key skills to help navigate complex services systems, building on your current skill set in providing support, and be able to demonstrate core staff attributes that are critical to working alongside individuals coping with complex housing challenges. Through a tour of a Toronto shelter and completing a shelter support activity, you will further learn about the city's diverse, precariously-housed populations. You will leave the course understanding how your support is critical to promoting change in the lives of individuals experiencing homelessness.

We recommend those wanting to work in the shelter system have additional hospitality, community and/or human services experience or education, as it is an asset to future employment.

Canadian Criminal Justice System | PFPR-101

0L

The Criminal Justice System consists of three agencies of social control: the police, the courts and the correctional system. As a Police Foundations program student, this course will assist you in becoming familiar with these three agencies, how they relate to each other and how criminal law impacts on all three.

Principles of Ethical Reasoning | PFPR-104

0L

Gain in-depth insight into all relevant characteristics of Canadian politics through this course, which will focus on the country's political history, present day fortunes and some future governmental aspirations. Content will mainly cover the federal political scene, with secondary coverage of the provincial and municipal governments.

Interpersonal and Group Dynamics | PFPR-123

0L

In this course designed for Police Foundations students, you will learn to apply knowledge from interpersonal relations and group dynamics to working in a team. Emphasis will be on utilizing effective communication skills with individuals and groups. Group cohesiveness and effective group decision-making will also be discussed.

Public Administration | PFPR-124

0L

This course will focus on organizational theories as they pertain to public administration. You will explore the organizational administration workings, and the interaction among federal, provincial and local governments. You will also develop an awareness of dominant and underlying issues related to law enforcement that affect the formal and informal political, public administration and management process.

Criminology for Policing | PFPR-125

0L

This course will cover various theoretical explanations of criminal and deviant behaviour, including the sociological, biological and psychological perspectives. With criminological theory's relation to various types of criminal activity, the reality of crime in Canada, including victimology, will be examined through crime statistics and correlations of criminal behaviour will be explored. Emphasizing future trends within the criminal justice system, the impact of theory on its development and effectiveness will round out the course.

Community and Child Studies

Issues in Diversity | PFPR-127

In this course, you will critically identify and examine issues in diversity. Specifically, you will focus on topics pertaining to inequality in various social settings. Among them will be race, gender, ethnicity, class and sexual orientation. Incorporating social and/or legal explanations of diversity, you will develop a clear understanding of the groups affected and the possible strategies of community empowerment. You will also explore the legal status of Indigenous people along with Indigenous rights and self-determination, and issues relating to land claims, justice and social services.

First Nations People | PFPR-128

0L

Increase your knowledge and awareness of important issues in the Indigenous cultures of Canada. The legal status of Indigenous People will be explored, along with Indigenous rights and self-determination, and critical issues relating to land claims, justice and social services.

Criminal Code | PFPR-203

0L

This course will introduce you to the most common criminal code offences. Offences against the person, property, weapons and public order will be examined. You will apply knowledge acquired in Criminal and Civil Law to determine the facts in the offences discussed.

Prerequisite: Criminal and Civil Law

Interviewing and Investigations | PFPR-204

0L

This course will focus on interview and investigation skills. You will develop the interviewing methods necessary to retrieve information from victims, witnesses and suspects. You will also learn basic investigation steps, including the practical development of note-taking and observation skills. You must have access to a video camera to complete assignments.

Youth in Conflict with the Law | PFPR-205

0L

You will examine the application of statues affecting youth in conflict with the law from philosophical, contemporary and historical perspectives. As well, the context of the Youth Criminal Justice Act and Young Offenders Act and other relevant legislation, detention, interviewing and processing through the court structure will be explored. You will develop the ability to summarize and appraise extra-judicial measures and disposition alternatives, which may be employed with a view to aiding and rehabilitating a youth while facilitating public safety and victim response. Class participation will be essential.

Prerequisites: Canadian Criminal Justice System, Community and Social Services.

Provincial Offences | PFPR-206

0L


In this course, you will learn to interpret and apply provincial statutes. Various – such as arrest, search and seizure authorities, common offences and the involvement of non-police agencies – will be explored, as will a range of statutes. Among them will be: Provincial Offences Act, Mental Health Act, Tenant Protection Act, Trespass to Property Act, Liquor License Act, Coroners Act, Family Law Act, the Blind Persons Rights Act, and the Game and Fish Act. Class participation will be essential.

You will learn the rules of evidence and develop the ability to apply these rules in the collection and presentation of evidence in a court of law. 

Standard First Aid (SFA) with CPR/AED LEVEL BLS | CCPR-101

Knowing First Aid lets you save lives. This comprehensive two-day course includes both a Standard First Aid (SFA) and Basic Life Support (formerly called Healthcare Provider Level CPR) certification. Designed to build confidence in performing First Aid and CPR skills in a team environment for healthcare professionals and first responders such as nurses, paramedics, firefighters and police who require both SFA and BLS certifications to satisfy program or license requirements. This course results in a one-year certification in Basic Life Support and a three-year certification in Standard First Aid. Basic Life Support must be renewed each year. See Basic Life Support (CCPR-102).

Basic Life Support (formerly Healthcare Provider Level CPR) | CCPR-102

The CPR standard for healthcare professionals and first responders with a duty to respond, this course teaches the important steps to perform a rapid assessment, perform Basic Life Support (BLS) skills, and perform rapid defibrillation including the use of an Automated External Defibrillator (AED). As a nurse, paramedic. allied health care provider (registered massage therapist, occupational therapist or physiotherapist) or dental professional you will greatly benefit from this training. Designed to keep skills sharp, this certification is valid for one year.

This offering now incorporates BLS Recertification (formerly CCPR-105)

CPR/AED Level C | CCPR-103

Knowing cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) lets you save lives. Most cardiac arrests occur at home or in a public place. This one-day course gives you the skills and confidence to recognize and respond to cardiovascular emergencies and choking for adults, children, and babies. It includes the latest CPR guidelines and use of an automated external defibrillator (AED). Designed for lay-rescuers, members of the public and those who only require basic CPR training, this course teaches the skills that everyone should know. Certification is valid for three years.

Blended Standard First Aid with CPR/AED Level C | CCPR-106

IC

Have a busy schedule and find it difficult to spend two-full days in the classroom? A Blended Learning course is equivalent to a traditional Standard First Aid course (CCPR-107); however, it only requires one-day in the classroom instead of two, increasing convenience and flexibility. There are two components: Online learning modules and in-class instruction. The interactive and self-paced online learning modules review first-aid information and theory. They can be completed a little bit at a time, or all at once. The one-day in-class component focuses on skills development and practical application. When registering for the course, students will receive a link to the online learning modules. Agricultural Biotechnology - Plant Cell Tissue Culture | PBIO-101

This course will provide you with theoretical knowledge and skills in the specialized field of plant tissue culture and micropropagation — with a focus on the major factors affecting in vitro plant regeneration and their application in research and crop improvement. If you are interested in learning more about the exciting field of agricultural biotechnology, or if you are considering a career in plant propagation, horticulture, or as a technician in medicinal agriculture, this course will result in the required fundamental knowledge.

Fundamentals of Genomics | GENO-101 IC

Genomics is an exciting and relatively new discipline that applies next generation sequencing (NGS) and bioinformatics to sequence, assemble, and annotate the structure and function of genomes. This course is a thorough review of genomics fundamentals that will prepare you to acquire an in-depth understanding of the structure and function of viral, bacterial and eukaryotic genomes, the Human Genome Project (HGP), as well as the organization of the eukaryotic chromosome. The course will not only cover various aspects of functional genomics, next generation DNA sequencing strategies for whole genomes and microbial informatics, but it will also include a primer on bioinformatics techniques, platforms and pipelines as they relate to the analysis of genomes.

Professional Practice (Biotechnology) | BI-321

This course will prepare you to enter the biotechnology industry. Over the course of your classes, you will learn about personal and professional development, effective science communication and etiquette, best practices in the laboratory, biotechnology laboratory automation, entrepreneurship and leadership. As the course is delivered through a blended learning format, you will spend two hours per week learning online and two hours per week in a face-to-face setting. The learning process will include a mix of interactive small group activities, inquiry-based learning modules and practical exercises.

Environmental Site Assessment Courses

Environmental Site Assessment (ESA), Phase 1 | CEEA-110

Divided into three parts, this course will introduce you to the full set of requirements and tasks for completing the Environmental Site Assessment Phase 1, which addresses contaminated sites and standards for evaluating the environmental liability associated with real estate. Part one will focus on preliminary site investigation, including reconnaissance surveys and reviewing the site's history. Part two will introduce professional, non-intrusive investigation of soils, geology and hydrogeology. During part three, you will conduct regulatory research, practice interviews with landowners and/or neighbours, and review documents from various environmental agencies. You will enhance your learning by participating in classroom exercises, workshops, group discussions and short presentations.

Environmental Site Assessment (ESA), Phase 2 | CEEA-200

IC

IC

IC

An introduction to a full reconnaissance testing program for the completion of the Environmental Site Assessment Phase 2, this course will emphasize field investigation at contaminated sites to determine the sites' condition. Presented in three parts, the course will start by covering intrusive site investigation (monitoring well installation, site subsurface investigation, ground penetrating radar survey, and groundwater level monitoring). It will then move on to soil and groundwater sampling and monitoring, which will include a focus on sampling methodology. At the end of the course, to cover synthesis of the site investigation (decision making), you will use term work to decide whether the potential site is clean or requires remediation. During this course you will participate in classroom exercises, workshops, group discussion and short presentations.

Food Safety Courses

BRC HACCP - Hazard Analysis Critical Control Point | HACC-100



IC

Hazard Analysis Critical Control Point (HACCP) is an important food safety management system commonly used in food processing to ensure quality. In this course, you will be guided through the development and implementation of a HACCP plan. You will review HACCP's five preliminary steps, including product description and process flow, and use a risk assessment approach to conduct the critical control point determination, which is based on the Canadian Food Inspection Agency and Food Safety Enhancement program. You will also become familiar with topics such as critical limits, monitoring, corrective actions and verification through the development of standard operating procedures, as well as the maintenance and audit of HACCP programs.

Upon successful exam completion, you will receive a BRC HACCP certificate.

Implementing SQF Systems for Manufacturers | SQFM-101 | IC

Often, growers, processors and manufacturers already have in place many of the food safety and quality programs found in the safe quality food (SQF) code, but an additional assessment that identifies gaps must be made to ensure they are fully protecting their product. This course is designed to enable you to fully understand the SQF code requirements in order to make you better equipped to implement and maintain an SQF system. This knowledge is the first step in achieving SQF certification. The course will benefit suppliers, consultants, trainers and anyone interested in learning about the SQF program.

Prerequisite: A two-day HACCP course, such as Centennial College's HACC-100 BRC HACCP - Hazard Analysis Critical Control Point course, or equivalent HACCP course with exam, must be taken prior to taking this

Introduction to Microbiology Courses

Introduction to Microbiology -Fundamentals | BACT-101



IC

This two-day course will introduce you to the smallest living organisms on the planet by providing you with the essential fundamentals of various types of microorganisms. You will spend the first day in the classroom learning about the different microscopic organisms that affect our health, and how they can be used in various industrial applications, such as making foods and decontaminating polluted soil. Day 1 will also cover important safety protocols microbiologists must follow in the laboratory. Day 2, meanwhile, will take place in our microbiology labs, where you will learn about the various equipment and instruments, such as pipettes, test tubes, slides and microscopes, which microbiologists use. Also covered during Day 2 will be fundamental safety procedures.

All equipment and supplies will be provided at no additional cost. There is no prerequisite knowledge required for this course.

Introduction to Microbiology -Light Microscopy | BACT-102



IC

An introduction to the light microscope, this course will examine the important and commonly used microbiology instrument. You will learn about the microscope's various components, how to prepare a specimen for viewing (including wet mounts and staining), and the art of focusing on a specimen (including oil immersion at 1000x magnification).

All equipment and supplies will be provided at no additional cost. There is no prerequisite knowledge required for this course.

Introduction to Microbiology – Cultivation | BACT-103



To introduce you to common methods to cultivate (grow) bacteria, you will review the various types of growth media microbiologists' use and learn to prepare growth media. The course will also cover performing a streak-plate to obtain isolated colonies, which you will then observe under a microscope using a simple staining technique.

All equipment and supplies will be provided at no additional cost. You must have prior experience using a light microscope, for example by having completed BACT-102.

Medical Lab Courses

ECG Workshop | MLAB-301

IC

This introductory-level electrocardiogram (ECG) course is an opportunity to learn a systematic approach to ECG interpretation for adult health care providers. The first lecture will focus on understanding the basic wave forms, complexes, intervals, segments and grid, with an introduction to identifying arrhythmias. The second lecture will focus on practicing a systematic approach to interpreting ECGs. The last session will be a practical component during which you will be able to practice performing ECGs with instructor guidance.

Phlebotomy Workshop | MLAB-201

IC

If you are a health care professional looking to refresh or obtain phlebotomy skills that will allow you to draw blood, this two-day workshop will teach you through both theory and hands-on training. The practical portion will include a simulation, during which you will draw venipunctures from mannequins and two venipunctures (one vacutainer and one butterfly) from your classmates under the supervision of a certified phlebotomist. You will be required to sign a phlebotomy waiver before performing venipuncture. It's recommended that you receive Hepatitis B immunization before taking blood on a human.

This workshop isn't intended to prepare you for employment as an MLA/T (visit the MLPAO or CSMLS website for more information on how to become a licensed MLA/T).

MLPAO (Medical Laboratory Professionals' **Association of Ontario) Courses**

MLPAO/CSMLS Prep (Medical Laboratory Technician) | MLTP-100







CNC Mill and Lathe Courses

CNC Mill (Level 1) - Manual Programming and Setup | CNCM-101

Geared toward the beginner, this course will teach you the basics of programming in G-Code, specific to vertical milling centres. You will manually program, set up, and operate computer numerical control (CNC) milling equipment, while receiving instruction in machine axis motion, operation of control panels, machine startup and common operations. Other topics will include program for-mats, editing, machine function control and program verification. During the course, you will manufacture simple parts using CNC milling equipment that will be used to learn basic quality control procedures.

CNC Mill (Level 2) – CAM Essentials | CNCM-201

Building on fundamental concepts from CNC Mill (Level 1), this course will move towards integrating CAD and CAM technologies. You will learn the basic design and toolpath functions of MasterCam, as it relates to CNC milling equipment. Using this software, you will create intermediate level parts that can be machined on a CNC mill and then use CAM software to create toolpaths from 2D and 3D geometry. To execute your own setup created in MasterCam, you will use the toolpath to produce a part. Safe CNC mill setup procedures will round out the course.

CNC Mill (Level 3) - Surfacing and Advanced Toolpath | CNCM-301

Designed for students who have completed CNC Mill levels 1 and 2, this course will focus on advanced mill setups, complex surfacing toolpaths, high speed machining, and program and cycle time optimization. The course will emphasize selection of surfacing tooling and coatings, optimizing chip load, tool ramping, and roughing and finishing pass optimizations. You will become familiar with advanced speeds and feeds calculations to optimize setups and cycle times.

CNC Lathe (Level 1) - Manual Programming IC and Setup | CNCL-101

To learn the basics of G-Code programming, you will manually program, set up, and operate computer numerical control (CNC) lathe equipment. You will receive instruction in machine axis motion, control panel operation, machine startup and common operations, while also becoming familiar with program formats, editing, machine function control and program verification. During the course, you will manufacture simple parts using CNC lathe equipment. The parts you manufacture will be used in learning basic level quality control procedures.

CNC Lathe (Level 2) - CAM Essentials | CNCL-201 IC

Building on the fundamental concepts from CNC Lathe Level 1, this course will move towards integrating CAD and CAM technologies. You will learn the basic design and toolpath functions of MasterCam, as it relates to CNC lathe equipment, and create intermediate level paths that can be machined on a CNC lathe using the software. You will then use CAM to create toolpaths from 2D and 3D geometry. With these toolpaths, you will execute your own setup created in MasterCam to produce a part. Safe CNC lathe set-up procedures will also be included.

CNC Lathe (Level 3) – Advanced Operation and Toolpath | CNCL-301

Designed for students who have completed CNC Lathe levels 1 and 2, this course will explore advanced lathe setups, complex radial tangential toolpaths, high speed machining, and program and cycle time optimization. Among topics the course will highlight the selection of surfacing tooling and coatings, optimizing chip load, tool arcs, roughing and finishing pass optimizations. You will also learn advanced speeds and feeds calculations to optimize setups and cycle times.

Architectural CAD 1 | ARCH-102

In this course, you will learn to use the latest version of AutoCAD for two-dimensional (2D) computer-aided drafting. You will pick up the basic and intermediate 2D AutoCAD drafting commands and printing skills to create architectural floor plans, building eleva-tions, building sections, details, schedules and site plans. You will also get hands-on experience making measured drawings for a small residential space.

Biomass Systems Installation, Maintenance and Repair | ENRG-101 IC

Biomass is a key element in government plans to increase renewable energy sources and reduce greenhouse gases. This course, which mainly focuses on biomass for electricity and heat, will provide a comprehensive overview of the status and developments in energy delivery from biomass combustion. It will look at fuel supply options, the emissions and plant performance implications. Using biomass for energy production has several associated technical, environmental and socioeconomic challenges, some of which will also be covered.

You will complete the course with a sound understanding of topics such as fundamentals and practicalities of the basics of solid biomass combustion, dedicated biomass installations, equipment maintenance and repair, biogas and landfill gas for process heat and power generation, and sustainability of biomass supply chains.

Energy Auditing | ENRG-300

This course — designed to provide principles, tools and techniques of energy auditing — will focus on how to energy audit (measure, assess, evaluate and analyze) residential and small commercial buildings using the correct instruments to prepare an energy audit report. You will learn to identify and compare relevant energy conservation measures and opportunities, save or optimize energy use and increase profit from energy saving, provide comfort in indoor environments, and reduce greenhouse gas emissions. Current legislation and available incentive initiatives will also be covered.

Gas Technician 2 (G2) Training (Module 10-14, 16, 21 and 23), Part 1 | GAST-201 | IC

This course provide education in the natural gas and propone heating field. You will acquire knowledge of the Technical Standards and Safety Authority (TSSA) and Canadian Standards Association (CSA) fuel code G2 regulations as described in the B149.1-15 and B149.2-15 gas codes. Coursework will include theory and lab training as you learn to maintain, size, select and install gas-fired equipment. This course will cover the following TSSA Gas Technician Certification Training Modules: Module 10 (Ad-vanced Piping and Tubing Systems), Module 11 (Basic Electricity), Module 12 (Controls), Module 13 (Building as a System), Mod-ule 14 (Domestic and Non-Vented Appliances), Module 16 (Domestic Gas Fired Refrigerators), Module 21 (Space Heating and Decorative Appliances), and Module 23 (Forced Air Add-On Devices).

Gas Technician 2 (G2) Training (Module 15, 17-20, 22 and 24), Part 2 | GAST-202

This course is a continuation of the GAST201 course. Students pursuing their TSSA Gas Technician 2 license must complete both GAST201 and GAST202 to complete all required educational modules. This course will cover the following TSSA Gas Technician Certification Training Modules: Module 15 (Gas Meters, Pressure Regulators and Relief Valves), Module 17 (Conversion Burner), Module 18 (Water Heaters, Combo Systems, Portable Water Heating Systems), Module 19 (Forced Warm Air Heating Systems), Module 20 (Hydronic Heating Systems), Module 22 (Venting Practices), and Module 24 (Air Handling Systems).

Prerequisite: Gas Technician (G2) Training (Module 10-14, 16, 21 and 23) GAST201

Note: A passing grade of 75 per cent is required on all course assessments. Upon completion of the G2 Training course, you must achieve a passing grade of 75 per cent or greater on the Certification of Qualification exam for Gas Technician 2 from TSSA. The exam is not included in this course. The Gas Technician (G2) Training Course does not guarantee that you will pass the Certifica-tion of Qualification for Gas Technician 2 exam.

History of Architecture | ARCH-206

IC

IC

This course is a comprehensive introduction to world architecture, which will start with an overview of the basic principles and ideas that gave birth to architecture and persist to modern day. Through the chronological study of architecture's evolution, you will examine social, political, religious, cultural and technological factors that transform and shape our built environment. The aim of this course is to provide you with a general perspective of architecture's development and the city through history, and to provide a basic understanding of the forces that shape the built environment.

Introduction to Revit | REVT-101

IC

IC

This hands-on lab course will introduce you to Revit, one of the most versatile and popular building information modelling (BIM) and computer-assisted-drafting (CAD) software packages available. Learning Revit will let you access tools and methods for producing, viewing and editing two and three-dimensional drawings in any discipline. In this course, you will gain an understanding of basic principles and operational techniques to effectively use the software. In-class exercises will give you the necessary practice for skill development.

Lighting Design for Professionals | LITE-201

IC

Designed for professionals to enhance their knowledge in the field of lighting design, this course will extend and fine-tune your competencies in line with the most recent technological and scientific discoveries, and innovations and uses. While no prior knowledge of electrical and lighting design experience is required, a basic understanding of how lighting and electrical system work is recommended.

Revit Module 2 | REVT-102

10

Revit Module 2 is a hands-on lab course that will build on the basic drawing and drafting commands taught in Introduction to Revit. You will be introduced to some of the more advanced concepts and tools in the Revit software. Weekly three-hour instruction in one of the College's Revit labs will consist of a brief lecture on software technique followed by a lab session. In each class, you will complete specific exercises designed to clearly illustrate these advanced Revit commands, which will provide you with the necessary practice for skill development.

Wind Turbine Installation and Maintenance (Basic) | ENRG-201

IC

To cover the theory governing wind energy systems and their working principles, this course will involve the description, theory de-sign and operation procedures these systems. Through both lectures and labs, you will learn about wind energy, small wind tur-bines, types of towers, wind controllers and how to complete a wind site assessment. A demonstration of how to properly tension guy-wire and lower the tower for maintenance purposes will be a valuable addition. You will leave the course with fundamental knowledge and hands-on experience of electrical and mechanical aspects as they relate to wind turbines.

G3, Part 1 | GAST-301

IC

This course will cover modules 1 through 4 and 4A of Gas Trade 3 training. It will provide knowledge of properties, characteristics and theory of combustion of natural gas and propane to ensure you know the installation standards, requirements and the approval agencies in the gas field. You will learn to use common gas industry manual and power tools, fasteners and supports, assemble and disassemble some gas appliances, and conduct a combustible gas leak detection and flue gas analysis. Safety issued related to gas will also be included, as will various codes, such as B149.1 and B149.2, and TSSA act and Ontario regulations pertaining to natural gas and propane installations and propane storage and handling.

G3, Part 2 | GAST-302

IC

TSSA Gas Technician training modules 6 (Technical Manuals, Specifications, Drawings and Graphs) and 8 (Introduction to Piping and Tubing Systems) will be explored in this course. Module 6 will focus on accessing accurate, current and relevant information for servicing or installing, and locating, reading and interpreting a variety of written documentation. Module 8, meanwhile, will cover piping and tubing systems used for gas (including valves and fittings), and how to size depending factors such as fittings and pipe length, the supply pressure, the direction change and installation location. To round out the course, you will also learn pressure testing and inspections that must be performed, to code, after installations.

G3, Part 3 | GAST-303

IC

TSSA Gas Technician training module 5 (Introduction to Electricity), module 7 (Customer Relations) and Module 9 (Introduction to Gas Appliances) will be the focus of this course. Module 5 will teach you basic electrical theory and practical trade-related applications, so you can safely and properly install gas appliances and systems. Module 7 will describe how to establish and maintain good customer relations, produce top quality work and ensure customer satisfaction. Lastly, Module 9 will provide you with the required knowledge about venting systems, types of burners, ignition systems, controls and safeties, and the characteristics of individual vented and non-vented appliances. This module will also explore details of safely and efficiently installing gas appliances, and it will cover requirements for converting appliances between propane and natural gas.

G3 Review and Test | GAST-304



IC

The Technical Standards and Safety Authority (TSSA) offers the Gas Technician 3 licence, which will allow you to work as a technician within the gas service industry under the direct supervision of a licensed G1 or G2 gas technician. If you complete a TSSA-approved G3 training program and pass the practical and theory provincial qualification exams, you will be eligible to receive the G3 licence from TSSA, which awards the certificate of qualification. This six-hour course will provide you with a review of the theoretical Gas Technician 3 material over two days and the theory exam over one day.

As a TSSA training and delivery agent, Centennial College is an approved provider of both the Gas Technician training courses and the required provincial qualification exams.

Note: You must have passed your TSSA practical exam to qualify for this course. Centennial students MUST have completed HRAC-111. HRAC-124, HRAC-121 and HRAC-123 with 80 per cent attendance (all four courses) and completed all labs with 75 per cent or higher, OR have completed and passed GAST-301, GAST-302, and GAST-303 within 12 months (one year) before the exam date (practical exams are only valid for one year).

Gas Technician Exam | GAST-404



IC

Candidates who have successfully completed a Gas Technician training program (delivered by a TSSA Accredited Training Provider) fulfilling all practical and class requirements may register in the GAST-404 to write their TSSA Gas Technician 3 (G3) or TSSA Gas Technician 2 (G2) theory examination.

Upon registration in GAST404, students will be contacted to submit a TSSA Application for an Ontario Certificate of Qualification form. Where indicated on the form, students must contact their TSSA Accredited Training Provider to complete the form as proof of the candidate's qualification to write the G3 or G2 exam.

For students who completed their training at Centennial College, please email energy.PT@centennialcollege.ca indicating your student number.

Note: GAST404 provide the examination for the G3 or G2 Certification of Qualification only. In-class training, practical training, and exam preparation are not included as part of GAST-404.

Fundamentals of Mathematics for Engineering | MATH-001

0L

This course will go over the basic fundamentals of mathematics required for engineering courses. It will include topics from algebra and trigonometry. Among the covered fundamental concepts will be integral exponents rules, roots and radicals, scientific and engineering notations, and rounding rules using significant digits.

You will: perform conversions between percent, fractions and decimals; apply mathematical principles and laws to perform algebraic operations; solve linear equations and systems of linear equations using various methods; rearrange formulas to solve for different variables; graph algebraic functions and find their domain and range; and perform fundamental operations involving the trigonometric and inverse trigonometric functions as well as solve problems related to right angle triangles.

Automotive Auto Body Courses

Introduction to Auto Body | CEAP-900

JV V

This course will introduce all of the basic areas of auto body repair. You will learn the use of hand and power tools, application of body fillers, two-stage putties and epoxy primer, minor dent repair, Oxy/Acetylene welding and GMA (MIG) welding techniques, and examine forming, flanging and contouring simple panels. A series of standard safety procedures when repairing a vehicle, proper identification of body panels, and proper tool uses and handling will also be included.

Advanced Auto Body | CEAP-904

IC

IC

Using Centennial College's extensive facilities, you will participate in identifying vehicles with bonded exterior panels, bonding panels using special automotive bonding adhesives, exploring the plastics used for vehicle construction and plastics repair. You will also learn to read dimension sheets, including datum plane, centerline plane and zero plane, and become familiar with measuring equipment.

Automotive Painting | CEAP-902

This course, the first of two on automotive painting, intended for both refinishers and car owners with an interest in refinishing. With a focus on the modern refinishing system of undercoats and topcoats — through classroom and hands-on work with primers, paint and painting techniques — you will learn about primer surfaces, putty, sealer, flexible agent, troubleshooting, types of undercoats and topcoats, overall application and more. You will be encouraged to bring in a project to work on.

Advanced Automotive Painting | CEAP-903

You will benefit from this course if you have already taken the foundational Automotive Painter 1 course, and you want to learn more about the modern refinishing system. Through in-class theory and practical lab application, after studying health and safety regulations, you will examine colour formulation, colour matching, and the principles of base coat and clear coat blending, spot repair and three-stage painting with pearls.

Damage Appraisal | CEAB-942

IC

If you have ever wondered how automotive damage is appraised and thought it would be an interesting area of work, this course can help you get your foot in the car shop. You will learn the methods and procedures for estimating collision damage, including flat rate schedules, labour rate computing, adjusting, forming discounts, releases, report writing, business procedures, policies and refinishing. Because legalities around automotive damage are also important, the course will examine the legal responsibilities of insurance companies, collision shops and vehicle owners. To round out training, hands-on lessons in the latest auto appraisal technology will teach you to analyze vehicle damage and create computerized estimates.

Paintless Dent Removal (PDR) Level 1 | CEAB-920

IC

Centennial College's fully equipped automotive labs are the ideal environment in which to gain the basic skills of paint less dent removal. This course will begin by covering the history of and techniques and basic metal finishing skills for paint less dent removal. You will then have the opportunity to analyze various dent types and paint conditions, and then experiment with removing dents from several metals, high-strength steel, different thicknesses as well as dents with and without access. Through demonstrations, group projects and hands-on exercises, you will also learn about picks, rods and glue pulling, polishing, door panels, wet sanding and polishing, plastic repair, heating, quenching and more.

Paintless Dent Removal (PDR) Level 2 | CEAB-925 IC

After learning the basic skills of paint less dent removal in PDR Level 1, this course will allow you to apply those basic skills to steel panels, aluminum panels and live lab vehicles. You will dive deeper into the individual setup, tools and procedures applied to repairing fenders, doors, quarter panels, roof rails, roofs and hatches. Through hands-on experiences, you will learn more about specialty PDR tools, blending and reflections. Lastly, group work repairing small- to medium-sized dents on live lab vehicles and through demonstrations will teach you to repair larger damage by push for paint, stress reliving and tension pulling.

Automotive - Electrical Courses

Automotive Electrical/Electronics 1 | CEAM-803

The electrical and electronic components of cars can be as complicated as they are fascinating. This course will help you to unravel the mystery of what's under the hood by providing you with a working knowledge of the basics of automotive electrical and electronic systems. You will start by learning electrical principles and their application in a variety of automotive systems, including batteries, charging and starting systems as well as instrumentation. With this base, you will move onto specifics such as relays, coils and solenoids, semi-conductors, starter motor circuits, alternators and electronic voltage regulators.

Automotive Electrical/Electronics 2 | CEAM-804

Not only is this course a review of Electrical/Electronics 1, but because it takes a more in-depth approach, it will also delve into more detailed coverage of specific automotive electrical and electronic systems. The course will examine the hall effect, charging system regulation, solenoids, relays and semiconductors as well as construction operation and testing of various components. Given the practical nature of the topics, you will gain hands-on practice by spending time in auto labs, where you will disassemble, reassemble, and bench test starters and alternators.

Suspension and Alignment 1 | CEBR-801

This course will cover the basics of tires, front-end, suspension and alignment theory, while also highlighting the practical application of inspection procedures of all related vehicle components. Not only will you come to understand tires, wheels balance, steering linkage, shocks and struts, ball joint inspection procedures, springs and curb ride height, but you will also be well versed in alignment terminology. Through practical demonstrations, you will learn the correct procedures for performing an inspection and diagnosis as well as the proper use of alignment machine equipment, which you will then get to implement during lab work.

Suspension and Alignment 2 | CEBR-803

Building on Suspension and Alignment 1, this hands-on course will provide additional training in the practical application of all aspects of front-end alignment, suspension and specialized brakes. Among specific topics will be: the correct use of the alignment machine, brake lathes, brake inspection, suspension inspection, wheel alignment, and brakes and anti-lock brakes.

ABS Brakes | CEBR-802

Using practical sessions, this course will teach you to identify brake components and perform a thorough brake inspection using specialized tools. You will learn to demonstrate various services such as brake friction material replacement and related hydraulic component services thanks to the inclusion of specific topics such as: brake part components, tools, analysis of inspection, applying analysis and repair, hydraulic component inspection and basic service, replacing hydraulic components and bleeding procedure. To conclude the course, you will complete an assignment that will encompass the learning strategies from theoretical and lab classes.

Air Conditioning Course

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Automotive Air Conditioning | CEAM-800

This course will introduce you to the basic theory of the automotive air conditioning system. Because you will be training at Centennial's automotive hub, Ashtonbee Campus, you will participate in practical application to reinforce the theory of topics such as system components, refrigerant flow, system pressures, the cooling system, special tools, diagnosis, compressors, hubs and clutches. Beyond learning how to use all the necessary tools to properly recharge an automotive air conditioning system, you will also become familiar with all the safety rules for properly handling refrigerants and alternate refrigerants as well as the pros and cons of using multi-blends.

Aircraft and Aviation Courses

Aircraft Sheet Metal | CEAC-800

IC

IC

Fabricating and repairing aircraft sheet metal is an essential job in the aircraft industry. This course is designed to instruct you on carrying out aircraft metal forming and riveting using hand and power tools. You will learn about the use of hand tools, cutting machines, rivets, bend and forming machines, and precision measuring instruments. Practical training in techniques for power and hand drilling, dimpling and counter sinking, riveting and rivet removal, and hand forming will also be provided. Beyond this, the course will cover general topics such as bend allowance and corrosion protection.

Canadian Aviation Regulations, Safety and Human Factors | AIRC-100

0L

This course is designed to provide you with an understanding and awareness of the importance of workplace safety and the impact of human factors in the aviation industry. Through a combination of theory and assessment activities, you will learn to identify and recall workplace and personal safety practices and procedures. Within the workplace safety area of study, specifically, you will develop a thorough understanding of the WHMIS program and a basic level conceptual understanding of safety management systems. A section on Canadian aviation regulations, meanwhile, will teach you to understand the legalities surrounding the maintenance of Canadian civilian aircraft and aeronautical products. At the end of the course, you will be able to interpret regulations for issuance of an Aircraft Maintenance Engineer (AME) licence.

This course satisfies the common requirements for all basic training courses as described in CAR Standard 566, Appendix C; Part 1.

Engine Courses

Automotive Engine 1 | CEAM-801

IC

If you have ever been curious about the design, construction and operation of automotive engines, this course is a great place to start training for your dream job. Automotive Engines 1 is a practical introduction that combines theory with a series of hands-on activities in our auto labs. You will gain a foundation of topics such as shop safety practices, tools and fasteners associated with engine service, principles of the two- and four-stroke cycle, types of engines and cylinder heads, valve operation and camshaft drive systems, and torqueing procedures.

Automotive Engine 2 | CEAM-802

IC

IC

IC

IC

This course will expand on Automotive Engines 1 by expanding on the concepts you learned and examining engine components in more detail. You will also gain insight into the design, construction and operation of both automotive cooling and lubrication systems. Once you have a base knowledge of cooling systems, you will be able to examine the principles of heat transfer, types of cooling systems, their components and purpose, and coolant. Other topics will include spark timing, compression, fuels, pistons and rings, wristpins, sealants, bearings, intake and exhaust systems. The wide range of areas covered in this course will make you competent in diagnosis and engine assembly.

Motorcycle Repair Courses

Intro to Motorcycle Repair | CEMM-801

Serving as an overview of the motorcycle and its components, this course will highlight how to buy, do routine maintenance on and winterize a motorcycle. Specific topics will include oil change, chain maintenance, safety checks, basic tune-up, and inspection of a motorcycle in relation to certification and purchasing, along with a basic overview of chassis. In fully outfitted labs that allow for hands-on participation, you will use lectures, videos and practical work to learn all about frames, suspension, steering, brakes, wheels and tires.

Motorcycle Engines | CEMM-802

Motorcycle Engines Level 1 and Level 2 will focus on the two most common engines found in motorcycles — the two-stroke and four-stroke — covering topics such as carburetion, lubrication, bearing types, fuel supply, air filters, and cooling and exhaust systems. Through lectures, videos and practical work, you will learn about principles of operation, variations on components and transmissions, and how to perform a practical strip-down, rebuild and setup of a four-stroke engine.

Motorcycle Electrical | CEMM-803 IC

If you are a motorcycle enthusiast who wants to develop an understanding of electrical systems and components, this module will examine ignition systems (including points, CDI and transistorized systems), charging systems, starting circuits as well as lights and signal circuits. Instead of just learning through lectures, you will complete practical lab work that will ensure you are confident with all tasks and topics, which will also include basic electrical theory and magnetism, Ohms Law, the use of digital multi-meters, motorcycle charging systems, lights and signals, the starting system, wiring diagrams and batteries.

General Interest Courses

Hybrid and Electric Vehicles | CESD-945

With hybrid and electric vehicles becoming increasingly popular, this course will benefit you if you want introductions to both types of vehicles — whether you are licensed or non-licensed. An overview of hybrid technology, along with its history and current electric car application, will give you a solid base. The course will also place emphasis on safe operating practices when servicing both hybrid and non-hybrid systems. You will learn through in-class lectures and lab activities that will include demonstrations, testing, accessing scan tool data and conducting sub system examinations.

MIG Welding | CESD-917

If you are new to MIG welding, this course will give you a hands-on understanding of machine setup, personal and shop safety, flat positional welding and vertical welding. Through lectures, safety videos, power point presentations and a range of lab work, you will become familiar with MIG welding fundamentals. The labs will include basic MIG welder maintenance, welder setup, running a bead, butt weld, lap weld, "T" joint and corner joint. You will complete the course able to confidently perform setup procedures for welding on steel as well as basic MIG welding.

Oxy-Acetylene Welding and Cutting | CESD-916

IC

IC

In this course, a practical, hands-on format will give you a foundation in oxy-acetylene welding and cutting. You will learn about topics such as personal and shop safety, oxy-acetylene torch setup, cylinder storage and care as well as regulator safety. To balance theory and practice, you will perform some fusion and braze welding and cutting in Centennial's automotive labs. You will leave the course with the ability to perform basic welding, heating and cutting procedures, and plasma arc cutting operations.

Small Engine Repair | CESD-933

IC

If you want to gain a working knowledge of the operation of air-cooled two- and four-stroke engines, this practical course is for you. In an interactive lab format that will include time for practical experiences, you will learn to diagnose, repair and maintain your gas-powered lawn care equipment. The course will also cover engine theory, health and safety, fuel systems, electrical basics and ignition types, with discussions on how engines, carburetion and ignition systems work. As a course customization element, you will have the opportunity to bring your gas-powered equipment to class and repair it under the supervision of an expert instructor.

Taxi Driver Training | TAXI-100

IC

In just 25 hours, you will be ready to start a career as a professional qualified taxi driver. Our fast and easy course is designed to teach you everything you need to know about driving in Toronto, and to get you on the road in no time. During your training, you will learn about customer service, cultural sensitivity training, taxi technology and receive in-car defensive training.

Accessible Vehicle Training | CEAV-100

IC

To obtain this endorsement, you are required to complete a training course that focuses on the development of knowledge, skills and abilities serving the accessible community. You will learn disability awareness and legal requirements, and receive practical training and assessment in the appropriate methods for assisting passengers with disabilities and securing wheelchairs. In 2017, when Aly Virji was asked to lead the Toronto
Police Service's (TPS) Diversity and Inclusion Unit on an

"I was able to use the ideas and concepts from the course by applying them to my own organization," he says.



Standalone Courses

Indigenous Peoples: A Global Perspective | HUM-312 OL

To gain an understanding of contemporary issues relevant to Indigenous Peoples around the globe, you will begin by exploring the patterns and themes of Indigenous histories, including the impact of European colonialism. Central to this study will be an analysis of land claims settlement issues, the quest for self-government, housing, education, culture, health and environmental, and social issues Indigenous Peoples are facing. The course will then focus on contemporary revitalization, repatriation and preservation methods employed around the world. This method of inquiry will allow you to compare the challenges and aspirations of diverse Indigenous communities.

Introduction to Complementary Therapies | GNED-120 OL

In this introductory survey course, you will study the history, development and practical application of complementary therapies and modern medicine. Beyond examining numerous specific complementary therapies from these perspectives, also highlighted will be therapies in recognized courses of study or certification that are offered in the complementary care practice.

Logical Self-Defense/Contemporary Canadian Issues | GNED-123

Ordinary language is highly deceptive, filled with tricks and sophisticated uses of subtle words and phrases that can mislead the unsuspecting. In this course, you will learn to distinguish types of language, such as description, explanation and argument, to discover how arguments are used to persuade and convince. By examining good and poor arguments from everyday life — in advertising, science and law, for example — you will sharpen your thinking skills. You will further develop your skills by becoming familiar with the three conditions of good argument: acceptability, relevance and good grounds.

Occupational Health and Safety | GNED-126 OL

The broad and ever-changing field of occupational health and safety is inherently technical. This course will introduce you to multiple dimensions of the various issues — technical, legislative, political and personal — relevant to this subject matter. Major topic areas will include the Occupational Health and Safety Act, WCB, WHMIS, transportation of dangerous goods, accident prevention and investigation, physical and biological agents, and the management of occupational health and safety programs.

Personality and Growth | GNED-128

PB

Personality psychology is a branch of psychology that defines what personality is and how it influences our behaviour and actions. This course will seek to understand how personality is developed. Through an examination of current research and theories, you will explore patterns of thoughts, feelings and behaviours that make a person unique. Personality assessment and intelligence testing will be explored.

Principles of Psychology | GNED-129 OL/PB

An introduction to the theoretical and practical discipline of psychology, this course's goal is to enable you to view your life and interactions from a psychological perspective, employing scientific methods and research information. The course will explore subfields of psychology such as biology, states of consciousness, learning, memory, motivation, personality, disorders and treatment. You will have the opportunity to view these subfields through the lenses of psychology's major perspectives: biological, psychodynamic, cognitive, behavioural and humanistic. Improving your well-being and social interaction will be part of the in-class process.

Principles of Sociology | GNED-130

You will also explore development across the physical, social, emotional and cognitive domains. Finally, major themes in the study of developmental psychology — including the nature-nurture issue, the effects of early experience and continuity-discontinuity in developmental change — will be addressed.

Ethics in Business | GNED-147

Learn about ethical considerations in contemporary business in this course. You will enhance your awareness of ethical issues and moral reasoning skills by examining moral frameworks and developing a model for ethical decision-making. 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
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
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
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
